Nagasaki, Japan (1945): Gilbert, *History of the Twentieth Century*: 40,000 killed instantly and 5,000 in next 3 months. 30 years later, final death toll is set at 48,857

People's Republic of China - Mao Zedong's regime (1949 - 1975): 40,000,000

Tibet (1950 - Date): 600,000

Babi Yar, near Kiev, USSR (massacre of Jews by Germans: Sep 1941): 33,000
PBS Nova: 34,000
Gilbert: 33,771 killed in 3 days
Harper Collins, *Atlas of the Second World War*: 33,771 according to "German records"
Michael Hamm, *Kiev*: 33,000 (29 - 30 Sep 1941)
Richard Overy, *Russia's War* (1997): greater than 30,000 (29 - 30 Sep 1941)
US Holocaust Memorial Museum

- Approximately 100,000 people were murdered at Babi Yar, *Historical Atlas of the Holocaust*: 33,000 in first two days
- *Holocaust Encyclopaedia*: "In the months following the massacre, Germans killed thousands more..."

Dnepropetrovsk, USSR (massacre of Jews by Germans: Oct 1941): 11,000

Kaunas (Kovna), Lithuania (massacre of Jews by Germans: Oct/Nov 1941): 15,000

Ponary, near Vilna, Lithuania (massacre of Jews by Germans: 1st wave, Jul - Dec 1941): 40,000

Historical Atlas of the Holocaust: 40,000 in 1st wave of killing (Oct - Dec 1941). Killing resumed Sep 1943

Michael Hamm, Kiev: "Perhaps 120,000 victims were buried there; another estimate puts the figure as high as 225,000"
Taras Kuzio, Ukraine: *Perestroika to Independence* (2000): "a mass grave reputed to contain over 200,000 bodies"

Bautzen, East Germany (Soviet concentration camp: 1945 - 1950): 16,000
09 Apr 1990 UPI: 16,000 German political prisoners died

Buchenwald, East Germany (Soviet concentration camp: 1945 - 1950): 10,000
11 Jun 1991 *Chicago Tribune*: 8,000 - 13,000 German political prisoners died

Kolyma, USSR (Soviet GULAG: 1930 - mid 1950s): 500,000
Adam Hochschild, *The Unquiet Ghost*: asked four researchers - "One estimated the death toll at 250,000, one at 300,000, one at 800,000, and one at more than 1,000,000"

Kuropaty, near Minsk, USSR (Stalinist GULAG massacre site: 1938 - 1939): 150,000
Raymond Pearson, *The Rise and Fall of the Soviet Empire, 2nd ed.* (2002): 30,000
Richard Overy, *Russia's War* (1997): 150,000 - 200,000 bodies
Ian Dear, *The Oxford Companion to World War II, "Belorussia"*: "several hundred thousand" in mass graves

The Great Soviet Purge, 1937 - 1938

In *The Great Terror*, Robert Conquest gave the following estimates of those arrested, executed, and incarcerated during the "height of the Purge":

- Arrests, 1937 - 1938 - about 7 million
- Executed - about 1 million
- Died in camps - about 2 million
- In prison, late 1938 - about 1 million
- In camps, late 1938 - about 8 million

Conquest concluded that "not more than 10 per cent of those then in camp survived." Updating his figures in the late 1980s, based on recently - released archival sources, he increased the number of arrests to "8,000,000", but reduced the number in camps to "7,000,000, or even a little less." This would give a total death toll for the main Purge period of just under "10,000,000 people".

Great Soviet Famine of 1926 - 1938, including the Holodomor

Richard Overy, *Russia's War* (1997): 4,200,000 in Ukraine + 1,700,000 in Kazakhstan

Green, Barbara ("*Stalinist Terror and the Question of Genocide: the Great Famine*" in Rosenbaum, *Is the Holocaust Unique?*) cites these sources for the number who died in the famine:

- Nove: 3,100,000 - 3,200,000 in Ukraine, 1933
- Maksudov: 4,400,000 in Ukraine, 1927 - 1938
- Mace: 5,000,000 - 7,000,000 in Ukraine
- Osokin: 3,350,000 in USSR, 1933
- Wheatcraft: 4,000,000 - 5,000,000 in USSR, 1932 - 1933
- Conquest:
 - Total, USSR, 1926 - 1937: 11,000,000
 - 1932 - 1933: 7,000,000
 - Ukraine: 5,000,000
